Introduction to WorldSkills Shanghai 2026

The WorldSkills Competition is the world's premier vocational skills competition representing the highest global standards of professional skill. It aims to enhance the vocational competence of young skilled workers, advance the WorldSkills movement, and foster exchanges and mutual learning for vocational skills development across countries and regions. It serves as a global stage for young people to showcase their mastery of skills.

The WorldSkills Competition is held every two years. The 48th WorldSkills Competition will take place from 22 to 27 September 2026 in Shanghai, China, with skill competitions running at the National Exhibition and Convention Center. Concurrent events include the WorldSkills Conference and the WorldSkills Expo.

WorldSkills Shanghai 2026 features 64 skill competitions across six sectors: Construction and Building Technology, Manufacturing and Engineering Technology, Creative Arts and Fashion, Information and Communication Technology, Social and Personal Services, and Transportation and Logistics. A total of 1,385 Competitors from 68 WorldSkills Member countries and regions will take part.

Adopting a unique perspective integrating policy and practice, the WorldSkills Conference 2026 will deliver a landmark event for the WorldSkills movement that builds global consensus, sparks innovation, and charts a sustainable future. It brings together policymakers, government officials, industry leaders, educators, and young people worldwide to discuss global skills development issues and trends.

As a key thematic sub-event of WorldSkills Shanghai 2026, the WorldSkills Expo features skills demonstrations and interactive experiences open to all. It offers a centralized platform for exchanges and exhibitions for the WorldSkills Member countries and regions, international organizations, Global Partners, Event Sponsors, vocational education and training institutions, and other skills development stakeholders.

Spectator Guidelines
